The Fifth Sunday of Lent

How would you define a great leader? We all have our own interpretations, but consider for a moment some common traits of those whose leadership has stood the test of time. In most cases you will find people who recognized very difficult things that had to be done. But rather than worry about the consequences, they somehow knew that the only thing to do was to forge ahead because it was the right thing to do; to hesitate, as they say, would be a losing option. Can we live our lives in such a way? Even in the smallest of circumstances, do we recognize that doing the right thing is the only thing to do?



Jesus was faced with what would be considered a difficult decision by most. A dear friend, Lazarus, lay dying in Bethany. Having been driven from the region because of his preaching, the disciples felt Jesus would be in danger if he returned. But Jesus' response was twofold in meaning. He waited two days, knowing he was to raise Lazarus from the dead as a miracle for all to witness, but he also wanted to show his disciples that no matter how difficult the task at hand may be, if it is something that is right and just, it must be done without hesitation or thought of self.

Jesus never wavered in his decision to go to Bethany despite the danger. Our friend the disciple Thomas, of course, opined that they might as well go with him and all die together. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that faith is certain (CCC 157). In Jesus' demonstration of love for his friend Lazarus, he showed that faith and despair are incompatible. We can never allow despair and fear to creep into our hearts; despair feeds upon itself and can consume our faith in the process. With faith, the courage of our convictions will always triumph.

Reflections from the homily delivered on March 22nd
by Father John P. Rosson

In just two weeks we celebrate Palm Sunday – the inauguration of Holy Week. We are at the midpoint of Lent’s journey. We meet an interesting figure. Few figures are as intriguing as this Nicodemus fellow who comes by night to be with Jesus.

This Sunday we find ourselves in the company of Nicodemus.

Who is Nicodemus?

Nicodemus is a **Pharisee**, a man of the **Sanhedrin**.

He is a gentleman. He is well read.

Nicodemus is the **timid disciple** Jesus chats with here.

Nicodemus has faith—he believes that Jesus has come from God—but when he comes face to face with Jesus, Nicodemus finds his faith challenged and reconfigured.

Be warned: What happened to Nicodemus can happen to us. Start with a question: What’s amiss in the way Nicodemus approaches Jesus? He’s a ruler of the **Pharisees, a scholar, a member of the Sanhedrin, wealthy, widely respected**--whatever could be lacking in Nicodemus’ faith? Nicodemus begins his conversation with Jesus by saying, “*Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.*” *On the surface, this sounds like authentic faith.*

Nicodemus comes to the Lord at night.

Nicodemus is not anxious to be seen by Friends in daylight with this stranger preacher. He had much to lose. He was an **after midnight follower**... He remains in the closet. Nicodemus is a respectable person, but shackled by conventions and fearful of great decisions. Jesus’s encounter with Nicodemus prompted Jesus to speak the greatest of truths.

“God so loved the world that He sent His only Son, so that whoever believes in Him may not die, but may have eternal life.”

That is greatest capsule version/ condensation of the entire Gospel.

We must not be too harsh on Nicodemus.

So many of us are zerox copies of Nicodemus. We hedge our bets with Jesus. We are afraid to place our lives on the table. An observer commented: “most people talk cream and live skim milk.”

“It is so much easier to become Christian when you aren’t one than to become one when you assume You already are.”

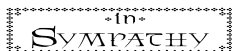

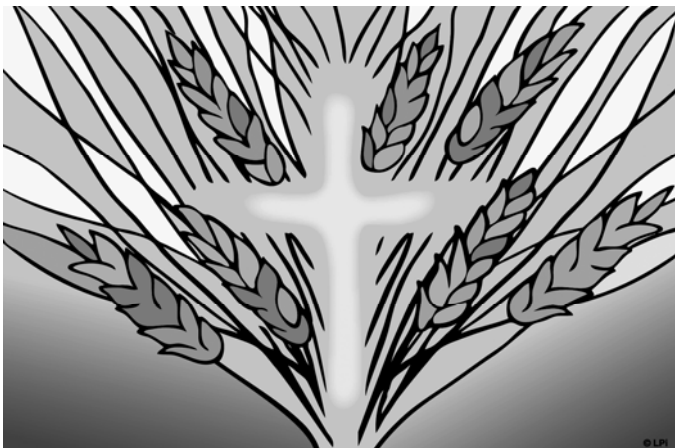
