Matthew 28:16-20

Today, in the Gospel, the Father is claimed by Jesus and the Trinity is proclaimed and given to those who are disciples of Jesus, "All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me." The son gives witness to the Father and the gift of the Spirit's work it echoes Jesus proclamation. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you: and behold I am with you always, to the close of the age."

By becoming and acknowledging ourselves as disciples we recall Christ's great commission and the call of the apostle: to teach, preach, and evangelize. The call is simple in a sense, for all nations and cultures to know Christ and to remain in His love. The depth of the call is that every area of the disciple's life, and their personhood, must be brought into Christ. This depth is so that evangelization may truly occur. There is a three-way method of discipleship found here—which in a sense is the heart becoming disciple within the actual evangelization, the sacramentalizing of the disciples and teaching of the Gospel of Christ (the gift of the Spirit begins this transmission first in baptism). In baptism the Trinity, through Christ, is transmitted obediently to His command in the gospel and by the giving of and the reception of the faith. More accurately, the person, the new follower/disciple is transformed by Trinitarian love; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The new disciple joins the Apostles and disciples on the hill today as Christ ascends to the Father, and sees the Church in the Body of Christ.

Our Challenge—the work of the disciple is to let this Trinitarian love penetrate. The sacraments and the faith are transmitted but there is an obstacle to growth—becoming true disciple. This is where we need Christ even more. God's love will not grow or penetrate until the disciple says yes to the Trinity. Our heart belongs to the Lord and longs for Him, but the Word, God's grace, will not be effective without our "Yes."

Saint Ignatius in teaching about the penetrating nature of Christ's grace wrote, "*It is true that the voice of God, having once fully penetrated the heart becomes strong as the tempest and loud as thunder, but before reaching the heart it is as weak as a light breath which scarcely agitates the air. It shrinks from noise, and is silent amid agitation.*"

We find this notation in the reflection section of St. Ignatius' Spiritual exercises. The good teacher Ignatius understands the threefold transmission and character of what God is asking of us as disciples. For Ignatius this is particular to the exercises, but we can easily apply this

to discipleship I general. In order to understand we need to follow the saint's teaching to understand what he mean. Ignatius is speaking of the "perfect docility of the heart," he writes "be afraid of refusing any thing to God: however small the sacrifice may be, perhaps our conversation, our salvation, may depend upon it. A single word of the Gospel converted St. Anthony; a word from a sermon converted St. Nicholas Tolentino; a fact of history, a reading, a conversation, begun the conversation of St. Augustine, of St. Ignatius of St. Francis Xavier. Can you tell to what sacrifice God may have attached the change of your heart? Enter, then, into the disposition of the prophet: "My heart, O Lord, is ready." (Ps.57,8)

Ask the Trinity to understand the depth of love that is our God. Surrender to Christ to find love and ask Him to make it so penetrate our hearts, minds and lives that we truly love in return. In the preface to the exercise we find the following prayer, may we ponder Christ as disciple, brother and sister, and today pray "My heart, O Lord, is ready" for your love.

I Love, I Love thee, Lord most high!
Because Thou first hast loved me;
I seek no other liberty
But that of being bound to Thee

May memory no though suggest
But shall to Thy pure glory tend;
My understanding find no rest
Except in Thee, its only end.

My God, I here protest to Thee,
No other will have I than Thine;
Whatever Thou hast giv'n to me,
I here again to Thee resign.

All mine is Thine, - say but the word;
Whate'er Thou willest shall be done;
I know Thy love, all gracious Lord;
I know it seeks my good alone.

Apart from thee all things are nought;
Then grant, O my supremest bliss,
Grant me to love Thee as I ought;
Thou givest all in giving this!
