As we continue to hear Saint John the Evangelist and the Bread of Life Discourse we are invited to deeply understand what it means to partake of the Lord. Some scholars have taken chapter six and broken it down into sections. The first half of the discourse opens with the statement "I am the Bread of Life (6:35). Followed by a "string of invitations to come to Jesus and believe in Him" for salvation. "The metaphorical import of Jesus' teaching is so obvious that it stands out in the response of the Jews, who ask Him, not why He calls Himself bread, but how He can claim to have descended from heaven (6:42)." This was our reflection last week. Today we begin to look at and understand the second half of the discourse. The natural break from first half to second half really begins at verse 48, where again Jesus says "I am the bread of life." It is an emphatic statement of identity for Jesus. God speaks in the "I AM" it means both title and identity. Remember this from the Old Testament when Moses is called by the Lord. "I AM the God of your father, he continued, the God of Abraham, the god of Isaac, the God of Jacob." Moses his face, for he was afraid to look at God. After their dialogue when God explains that He will send Moses to free His people. Moses is afraid and wants more of this relationship. How can I do these things? God explains, because I will be with you. Moses is ready, but after thinking about how the people will react to him, he asks the Lord, "Who do I tell the Israelites sent me?" "What is your name?" God answers Moses, tell them "I AM WHO AM" Tell them "I AM sent you."

Here we can see and understand how much of what Jesus says should resonated from the Mosaic piece of salvation history; freedom sought and found. Remember Moses is but an archetype for the one who is to come and bring freedom, to save God's people Israel. Jesus is not an ambassador for God, like Moses, rather HE IS the great I AM. (see Exodus 3:6-14) This is the literal point of Jesus teaching today and the literal part of the anxiety of the Jewish people in the gospel. "How can we eat His flesh?" Our faith teaches us, and this must always be clear. The bread is not a symbol of Jesus, or a sign of our community. "I myself am the living bread come down from heaven...The bread I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

We believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, body, blood, soul and divinity. Really Jesus.

We meditated on the Prologue of the Catechism last week and on Saturday celebrating the gift of Mary's Assumption into heaven. We celebrate Mary's song - Her Magnificat - "the hungry He has filled with good things." Mary teaches us that God's saving power and mercy come literally to us by being fed by our God; we know this as we receive the Eucharist. "He calls man to seek Him, to know Him, to love Him, with all his strength...In his Son and through Him, He invites men to become, in the Holy Spirit, His adopted children and thus heirs of His blessed life." (*Prologue C.C.C.*) Mary knows this completely, she has been assumed into the gift that we both celebrate and share in; the Eucharist. By continued meditation on the gift of Christ we too can be moved by the gift we celebrate and be carried home. This is our Hope. "He who believes has eternal life." "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live for ever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh."
